

# EU funding program: Erasmus+ Youth

Erasmus+ Youth (2021 - 2027) offers funding opportunities for mobility and intercultural experiences, further education and transnational cooperation and participation of young people in political processes relevant to them.

## Overview of funding opportunities

### Youth exchanges

Youth exchanges bring together groups of young people from different countries to discuss a specific topic (e.g. climate change, youth culture, combating racism, etc.). The focus is on getting to know each other and intercultural exchange. This can be done using a variety of methods: Group exercises, role plays, debates, outdoor activities, workshops or public campaigns.

### Mobility for professionals

Projects are supported that promote the exchange of knowledge and the acquisition of new skills by people in youth work: seminars, training courses, networking meetings, study trips and job shadowing. The aim is to contribute to quality development in youth work in Europe through exchange activities and networking.

### Youth participation activities

Support is provided for projects that focus on the active participation of young people. Participation projects can take place locally, nationally or transnationally. The aim is to strengthen youth participation at all levels, arouse interest in European issues among young people, promote digital skills among young people and bring young people together with politicians in the spirit of the EU Youth Dialogue.

### DiscoverEU Inclusion

DiscoverEU Inclusion gives young people aged 18 to 21 who are unable to travel due to social, economic, geographical, health or other barriers the opportunity to discover Europe by train.

## Cooperation partnerships

Organisations can work together with transnational partners in this project format and exchange experiences. The development, transfer and implementation of innovative practices in the youth sector are central to this.

## Smaller partnerships

This project format is aimed at smaller organisations or those that have little or no experience with Erasmus+. Here, at least two partner organisations from at least two different countries can work together, exchange ideas, learn from each other and develop new ideas for the youth sector.

## Advice and information

In addition to the OeAD, the national agency for Erasmus+, regional offices are available in all federal states to provide information and advice on the programme.
